On July 1, 1960, the public libraries located in Cumberland, Frostburg, LaVale, Pennsylvania Avenue School, and Westernport came together to form the Allegany County Library System.

Our Washington Street Library was initially housed in a private residence on Greene Street. Then called the Cumberland Free Library, it moved to the historic building it currently occupies in 1934.

The Washington Street building, originally built for the Allegany County Boys Academy in 1863, temporarily served as a civil war hospital for Union soldiers in 1865.

Our Frostburg Library occupied a vacant grocery store and the first floor of a Masonic Temple before community fundraising made the construction of a library building possible in 1960. In 1999, the current larger library was built across the street from the 1960 building site.

Our LaVale Library occupied the corner of a Rexall Drug Store and a vacated State Police Barracks before the LaVale Civic Improvement Association raised the money to build the current facility in 1975.

In 1989, the citizens of the George's Creek region began raising funds to build a library of their own. Completed in 2001, the library was built to resemble an Iron Furnace and the library's dedicated local history collection pays homage to the regions rich history of coal mining and iron blasting.

In 1924, a small group of Westernport residents solicited the donation of a little over 100 books and secured permission from the City Council to house them in the city building. Construction on the current facility began in 1969 and the new building was dedicated in February, 1970.

The South Cumberland Library began in 1934 in a classroom in the Pennsylvania Avenue School. In 1965, it moved to Virginia Avenue until the facility it currently occupies was built in 1982.

A fine of \$20.00 or higher on your card will result in suspension of privileges until the fine is paid.

Youth accounts, or those 17 and under are fine free and are not charged overdue fines. Lost and damaged charges still apply.

HOW DO I GET A LIBRARY CARD?

Allegany County Library cards are **FREE** to all Maryland residents.

Just provide a photo ID with your current Maryland address and you are eligible.

Out of state residents can also get a card for just \$10.00 per year.

"STAR cards" are automatically created for all K through 12 students in Allegany County at a participating school. STAR cards are virtual cards that allows students to check out books, use library databases, and get homework help.

Allegany County "One Card": May be used at The Alexander Library of Allegany College of MD and at the FSU Ort Library. Your ACLS Library card may be used at public libraries throughout Maryland.
