





























The Lost History of Frederick Douglass in Cumberland & Allegany County





National Library Week is April 3 - 9


All branches of the

Alice Darr Arts Scholarship Contest

Allegany County Public School students in grades 9-12 are invited to submit art works which represent local African American History. Students must also submit a 250-500 word essay describing the event, place, individual, or family depicted in their work as well as the significance to local history.




























DONATION DO'S AND DONT'S

The library strives to provide the best quality and most up-to-date materials as possible. With this in mind, the library can typically accept donations of material in good condition that have been published in the past 2-3 years. Any materials that cannot be added to our collection will be made available for free to the public. We've compiled a list of library donation do's and don'ts for when considering to donate books, audio, or video items to the library.

Do's:

- Go through all the books. Sometimes, when we go through those donations, we find things like photo albums, yearbooks, handwritten recipe cards, things you may want to keep.
- Call and ask before you donate. Some branches may not be taking donations at this time.
- Support your library in other ways. Books are just part of the services our libraries offer. Things like Chromebook & Wi-Fi Hotspot checkouts, Story Time programs, public computer use are all essential services to our community. Consider a monetary donation to help in other areas of library service.

Don'ts:

- Don't donate material:
 - with pages highlighted or underlined
 - emitting odor
 - that is discolored, or yellowed with age
 - with incomplete or missing parts
 - Like Textbooks, test prep, encyclopedias, Reader's Digest, magazines, or newspapers.
- Don't leave donations in a public space, outside, or in/near the book drop
