has installed two electric vehicle fast-charging stations in the Frostburg Library parking lot. These stations are part of Potomac Edison's EV Driven pilot program designed to benefit and support Maryland's goal to reach 300,000 zero-emission vehicles on the road by 2025.

These direct-current fast charging stations can provide 80% charge for most electric or hybrid vehicles in less than an hour.

Everything You Wanted to Know about the LaVale Library



Why Are We So Excited?

- The Community Living Room/Reading Room
- The two large meeting rooms that can be combined to accommodate 100 person events
- The large outdoor patio has space for: reading, events, story time, performances, etc.
- The loading dock and receiving room will help make the cataloging process more efficient to get books and materials into your hands quicker!

Where does the money come from to fund this renovation?



Total cost \$4.8 million: \$4,320,000 Maryland State Library Capital Grants Program \$480,000 Allegany County Government (Non-Operational Funds)

Most of the money for the LaVale Library renovation comes from The Maryland Public Library Capital Grants Program, which means only about 10% of the costs come from the Allegany County Government. As it is capital funding, none is available to use for the library's operating expenses like staff salaries or utilities (because we won't have it again next year).

Why is construction taking so long?

The project is actually on schedule. There was a delay in receiving steel due to the supply chain delays for the additions to the building, but work shifted to renovations of the existing structure until the steel arrived.

Construction is scheduled to be complete by mid-summer and the ribbon cutting is scheduled for September 23.



I've heard the term, "flagship" library, what does that mean?



The LaVale Library will be the largest in the Allegany County Library System, including the largest meeting rooms, the largest collection, and the largest staff. However, this does not mean that the resources available to those that visit the LaVale Library will be any different than those at any of the other libraries. You can expect the same great service as you have always received at all of our locations.

Will any of the other libraries close?

No, Allegany County Library System expects to secure the funding to maintain the current number of hours at all the library locations as well as reopen the LaVale Library with extended hours. But, you can expect the hours of operation to change based on community feedback during the budget presentation process to include evening hours.
