### **ACLS HITS THE ROAD!**

Most people know about the wealth of stories available at the library, from picture books and large print to audiobooks and eBooks. But there's so much more to the story of our libraries. And the next chapter for the Allegany County Library System includes four wheels...

We are excited to announce that we will soon add an additional way to serve the community with a new **Events and Outreach Van.** Through Cares Act funding in 2021, we started the journey to develop a mobile vehicle that could further the presence of the library in the community and at partner events and further contribute to being a true community hub.

According to the 2020 Census data, Allegany County has one of the highest rates of households without a vehicle, over 26% in



some areas. We want to focus on these communities that may not have the opportunity to visit a brick and mortar library. Because public transportation in Allegany County is extremely limited, the need is evident to take library services out of the buildings and into neighborhoods and parks.

Plans for the Events and Outreach van include services such as lifelong learning activities, knowledge & skill development classes, workforce development opportunities, and pop-up libraries.



In addition to reaching portions of the county that are currently underserved due to geographical distance, the goals of the Events and Outreach Van are to continue to close the digital divide in Allegany County as well as build the capacity to strengthen partnerships with community organizations.

The Events and Outreach Van is expected to launch during Summer with Your Library!
