ACLS libraries closed on March 14, 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic and staff uickly chapted services to meet the needs of the community. Library staff removed fine blocks on using digital collections and databases, moved story times into local parks and onlife with over 1,500 live attendees, and migrated to a temporary Sidewalk Service model to the Library books, movies, and more materials into the bands of the community.

### Successful Reopening in March

Despite the success of the modified service and programs, library staff were dedicated and worked tirefessly to god by reopen the libraries and restore services that only exist in the balding like public computer access and browsing through collections.



### Reaming Patrons in new Ways

From the new ACLS reader's advisory podcast, Let's Get Lit, to launching a brand new print publication and reading classic holiday stories on the radio, Allegany County Library System staff found new and creative channels to reach patrons while building access was limited.



# Joining the conversation: Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion

Following PGCMLS's virtual visit with Dr. Ibram X. Kendi, the ACLS staff felt the local community wanted to continue discussing these important topics on race in America. In the fall of 2020, library staff hosted a series of virtual book discussions on "Stamped From the Beginning" by Dr. Kendi. The series was well attended and received positive response from the community. Staff members Ali Cline and Courtney McKay-Jensen, were honored with the MLA's 2021 Outstanding Paraprofessional Award for their work in arranging and moderating the wildly successful series.

### **Chromebooks and Hotspot Partnerships**

By partnering with the City of Cumberland and the Western Maryland Regional Library, the Allegany County Library System began loaning Chromebooks and WiFi Hotspots in April 2021. The program provides much needed internet access in underserved communities, further closing the digital divide in the area.
